## **Policy**

Members must be physically capable and free from any medical condition that would impair their ability to perform their duties safely and effectively.

### **Reasons for Policy**

To ensure that members can perform their duties safely without putting themselves or others at risk.

#### **Definitions**

Member: Includes both volunteers and employees

Trichromacy: Normal colour vision

**Bona fide occupational requirement**: A good faith belief with no intent to discriminate that the noted standards/requirements are directly related to real job conditions and duties.

Supervisor: Station Leader, Training Officer or Coxswain

#### **Guidelines**

1. In a search and rescue (SAR) environment operational members must be physically capable of safely performing their assigned duties.

#### To that end:

If there is any question about a member's physical ability to carry out SAR activities or if a member has a progressive medical condition that limits their physical or mental ability, they must report same to their supervisor and seek a medical clearance to continue to act in a SAR capacity.

\*Note some medical conditions can be addressed for the purposes of SAR using assistive devices (glasses, contact lenses, hearing aides etc.).

2. In a marine environment it is imperative that a member can distinguish between colors and notably red and green.

To that end:

Members must possess normal colour vision (Trichromacy) to be engaged in search and rescue operations. Normal colour vision is a bona fide occupational requirement.

Members must advise their supervisor if they do not have normal colour vision.

**Member Resource:** The Annual Safety Review provides members with an opportunity to also conduct an annual assessment of their personal health and well being utilizing the Par-Q form (attached).

**Accommodation:** Members that cannot meet the physical requirements of marine search and rescue activities may be accommodated in another capacity or in a supporting role within RCMSAR.
