Definitions

ROC-MC: Restricted Operator Certificate – Maritime Commercial

Guidelines

All personnel are required to follow the crewing qualifications and training requirements in this document when operating an RCMSAR vessel underway.

Important: New Crew are considered as members in training (MIT) and cannot contribute as a valid crew member on any DRV.

Crew and New Crew in an RCMSAR Vessel

- Crew
 - Completion of Crew Level signoffs
 - PCOC or higher
 - ROC-M or ROC-MC
 - Valid SFA/OFA2 plus CPR “C”/AED or higher
 - Valid Crew physical Assessment test
 - 20 hrs. sea time in the last 12 months
- New Crew
 - Chapters 1,2,3 completed from the RCMSAR Training Manual
 - Completion of New Crew Level signoffs
 - PCOC or higher
 - Valid Crew physical Assessment test
